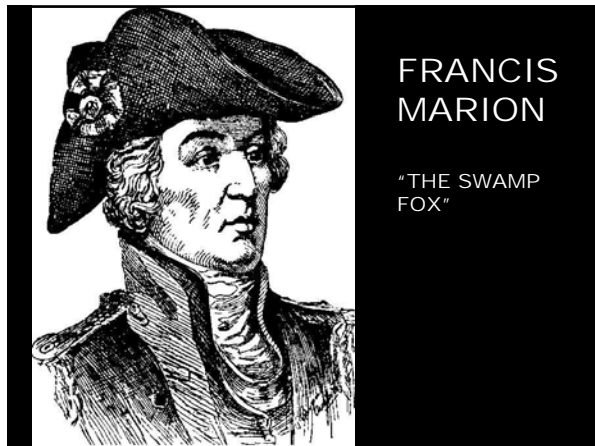

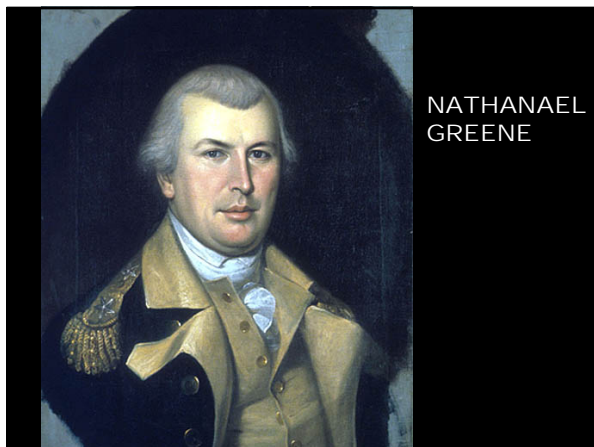

The British camp at Yorktown because it was on a peninsula and was easy to get supplies from ships



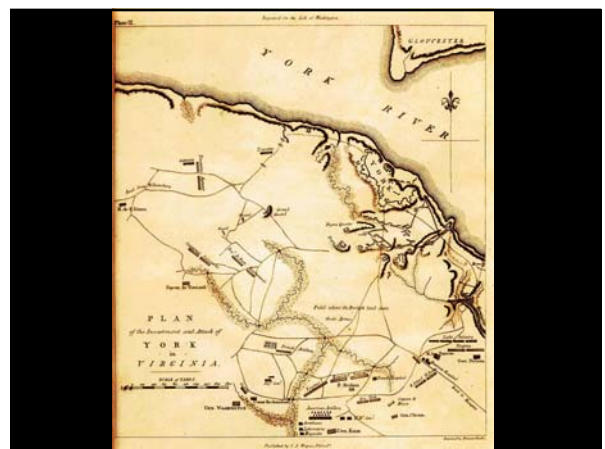
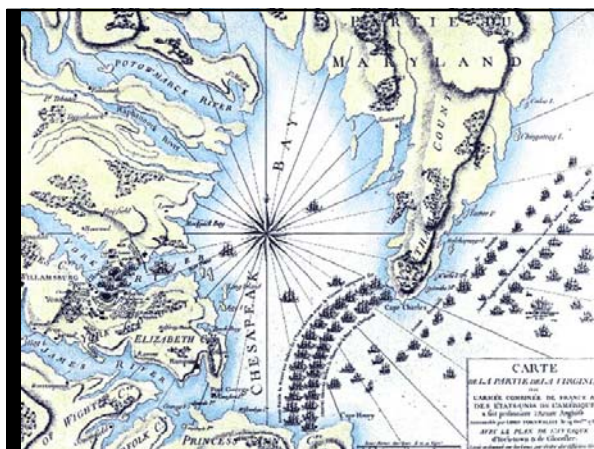

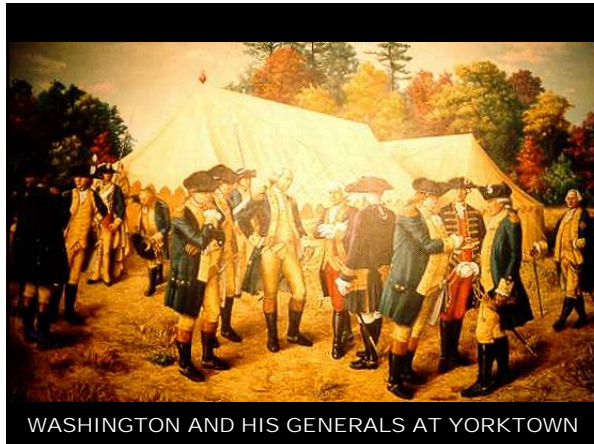


Washington and his troops sealed off the land route out



The French navy trapped the British from escaping by sea





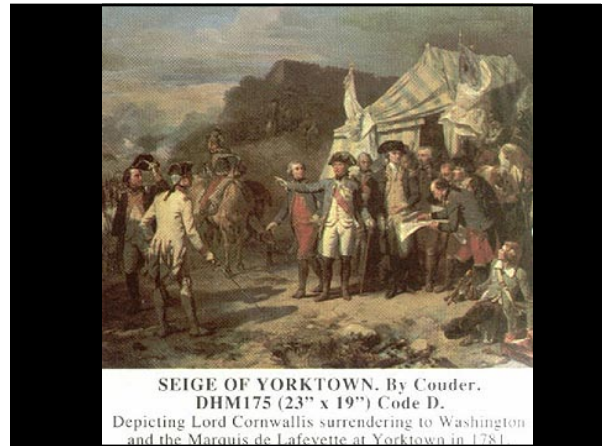
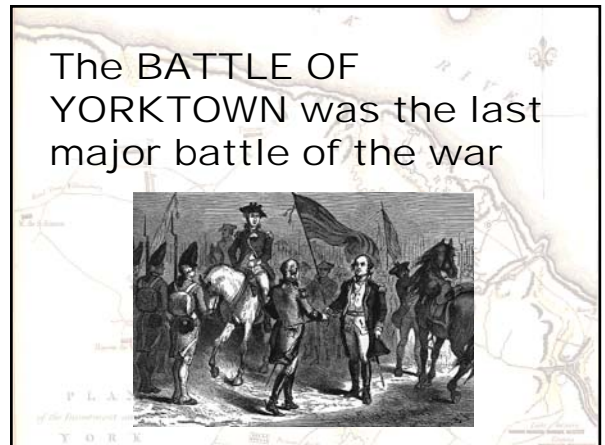
WASHINGTON AND HIS GENERALS AT YORKTOWN
